Highlights from the 2022 Annual Report of the Board of Trustees

This Annual Report of the Lawyers' Fund for Client Protection focuses on the Fund's activities in calendar year 2021, the 54th year of operations of the Lawyers' Fund. The Lawyers' Fund for Client Protection ["Fund"], known as the Clients' Security Fund before 1991, was created by the New Jersey State Bar Association in 1961 and formally established by the Supreme Court of New Jersey in 1969. Its purpose has always been to reimburse clients in those rare instances when a lawyer betrays a client's trust by misappropriating funds.


The Fund is governed by *Rule* 1:28 of the New Jersey Court Rules, which was established in 1969. Rules and Regulations adopted by the Board of Trustees and approved by the Supreme Court of New Jersey provide for the administration of the Fund, the exercise of the Trustees' investment powers, and the procedures for the presentation, consideration, and payment of claims.

There are 99,815 registered lawyers in New Jersey. Over the 54 years of our existence, a small number of former lawyers each year have been responsible for the dishonest conduct resulting in the Fund's awards. In 2022, 26 now suspended, disbarred, or deceased lawyers were responsible for the client losses reimbursed by the Fund. In 2022, the Trustees approved 43 awards, providing almost \$900,000 in total reimbursement to eligible law clients for losses caused by the dishonest conduct of former New Jersey state lawyers. The Lawyers' Fund is permitted to reimburse up to \$400,000 per client, up to \$1.5 million per lawyer, unless a variance is sought from the Court.

Annual Billing

The Fund again handled the annual assessment for itself, for the Disciplinary Oversight Committee (DOC), which funded the Disciplinary Review Board and the Office of Attorney Ethics, for the Board on Continuing Education (BCLE), Lawyers Assistance Program (LAP) and the Board of Bar Examiners (BBE). Out of the \$212 paid by New Jersey lawyers in their 5th through 49th calendar year of admission, the Fund received \$46, DOC received \$148 (of which \$2 is paid to BBE directly by DOC), LAP received \$10, BCLE received \$4 and BBE received \$6, (\$4 from the Fund, and \$2 as previously mentioned from DOC); lawyers in their third or fourth calendar year of admission paid \$183 that was split \$21 to the Fund, \$148 to DOC (of which \$2 is paid to BBE directly by DOC), \$10 to LAP and \$6 to BBE, (\$4 from the Fund and \$2 as previously mentioned from DOC). Lawyers in their second calendar year remained exempt with the Fund but paid \$35 that was split \$25 to DOC (of which \$2 is paid to BBE directly by DOC) and \$10 to LAP. The Fund and DOC shared

■ DOC ■ Fund ■ LAP ■ BCLE ■ BBE




expenses as well as revenues, but the 50-50 division of costs did not reflect the revenue split.

New Jersey Bar Population


The number of lawyers in New Jersey increased from 98,582 to 99,815. New lawyers added to the list of licensees totaled 1,866, while 1,633 deletions included 819 revocations, 515 deceased, 285 resigned, and 14 disbarred. The breakdown of the billing status for members of the Bar was as follows:

Claims Filed and Claims Disposed

The number of claims filed in 2022 decreased to 51, down from 59 filed in 2021. Claims pending during 2022 totaled 75, of the 51 new claims, 54 were pending at the beginning of the year, and there was one previously disposed claim that was revived. Claims disposed included 43 approved, 2 discontinued, and 12 rejected. At year's end, 18 claims remained pending. The total claimed loss was \$3,692,572 and the total maximum payable was \$3,093,623.




and 105 in 2020. The total value of claims paid decreased to \$893,214 in 2022, down from \$1,461,181 paid in 2021 and \$3,598,300 paid in 2020. The average payments have been \$32,483 in 2019, \$34,270 in 2020, \$22,603 in 2021, and \$21,267 in 2022. In the Fund's 54 years, 4,877 claims have been paid against 861 respondents. Twenty-six former lawyers were responsible for the damage in 2022. The nine lawyers with highest amount in payouts of the \$891,714 paid are shown above.

Subrogation Recovery and Collateral Sources

In 2022, the Fund collected \$639,562 in total subrogation receipts including costs. This was approximately 32% less than the previous years' collection. A significant portion of this decline is attributed to a backlog of pending petitions for the release of monies held in the Superior Court Trust Fund. At the end of 2022, the Fund had a total of 12 such petitions seeking the release of \$423,778. The Fund collected \$990,894 in 2018, \$1,010,280 in 2019, \$1,671,750 in 2020, and \$945,972 in 2021. Money saved by the Fund due to claims paid by collateral sources has also varied over the years. The Fund saved \$496,000 in 2018, \$215,514 in 2019, \$4,000 in 2020, \$49,170 in 2021, but had no such payments in 2022.



ANNUAL REPORT FOR 2022

History and Purpose

The Lawyers' Fund for Client Protection ["Fund"], known as the Clients' Security Fund before 1991, was created by the New Jersey State Bar Association in 1961 and formally established by the Supreme Court of New Jersey in 1969. Its purpose has always been to reimburse clients in those rare instances when a lawyer betrays a client's trust by misappropriating funds.

The Fund is governed by *Rule* 1:28 of the New Jersey Court Rules, 1969. Rules and Regulations adopted by the Board of Trustees and approved by the Supreme Court of New Jersey provide for the administration of the Fund, the exercise of the Trustees' investment powers, and the procedures for the presentation, consideration, and payment of claims.

Board of Trustees

The Fund operates under the direction of a volunteer, seven-member Board of Trustees comprised of five lawyers and two non-lawyers. Members are appointed by the Supreme Court of New Jersey to serve staggered five-year terms. The Trustees serving at the close of 2022 were:

Fund Resources

New Jersey lawyers and judges, as well as lawyers granted permission to practice in New Jersey, pay into the Fund each year. The Fund receives \$21 from New Jersey lawyers in their third or fourth calendar year of admission, \$46 from those in their fifth through 49th calendar year of admission, and \$46 from *pro hac vice* attorneys, multijurisdictional practitioners, in-house counsel, foreign in-house counsel, and foreign legal consultants.

Proper Claimant

A successful claimant must prove an attorney/client or fiduciary relationship with a lawyer and show a compensable loss, that is, that the lawyer misappropriated money collected in trust on behalf of the claimant. A successful claimant must prove the case by showing receipt by the lawyer of money or property belonging to the claimant, conversion of funds by the lawyer, and a loss resulting from dishonest conduct.

The Fund's Limited Jurisdiction

Before the Fund can formally begin its investigation, the lawyer who is the subject of a claim must be suspended, disbarred, deemed disability inactive by order of the Court, or deceased. Claims involving ill-advised or unfortunate investments placed through attorneys, and professional negligence or allegations of malpractice are not compensable by the Fund. The Fund does not generally pay for consequential damages.

How to File a Claim

Claim forms can be requested in writing, by telephone, through the Fund's webpage or, beginning in 2022, electronically online through a secure portal created as part of the Fund's Case Management System. Claimants can sign a certification in lieu of oath pursuant to *Rule* 1:4-4 (b), thus eliminating the need to find a notary or lawyer for signature verification. The Fund's staff will assist callers with the filing process. The original and two copies of an executed claim form must be submitted. There is no filing fee and a lawyer assisting a claimant with a claim to the Fund may not charge a fee (*Rule* 1:28-3(f).

How Claims are Decided

The Fund's legal staff reviews and investigates all claims and prepares a comprehensive agenda for the Board of Trustees to consider. The Trustees meet monthly to decide claims. *Rule* 1:28-3 gives the Trustees sole discretion to decide all claims, including the amount, timing, and conditions of payment. In some instances, a hearing is held to take testimony from the claimant, the respondent, and any other persons with relevant knowledge concerning the matter.

Limits on Claims

There is a limit of \$400,000 per claimant for claims arising after January 1, 2007, with an aggregate maximum of \$1,500,000 for claims paid against any single lawyer. The Court has considered requests by the Board of Trustees for a waiver of the aggregate maximum on a case-by-case basis to best serve the Fund's mission. In 2022 one such request was made and granted by the Court with respect to claims against Steven Salami.

Recovery of Payments Made

For every claim that is paid, the Fund and the claimant will execute a *Release, Assignment and Subrogation Agreement* that will then permit the Fund to pursue the claimant's rights against the dishonest lawyer and anyone else that might be liable under the law. It is the Trustees' policy to

seek reimbursement from any responsible party for all claims paid in order to protect the integrity of the pool of money that they administer on behalf of the Bar.

Overview of 2022 Activity

Board of Trustees

The Board held its organizational meeting in January. The Board elected Stuart Lieberman as Chair, Carmen Cortes-Sykes as Vice Chair, William Trimmer as Treasurer, and Reginald Coleman as Alternate Treasurer, each to serve a one-year term. The Board voted to reappoint the staff, including Director and Counsel Daniel Hendi, Michael McCormick as Deputy Director and as Acting Director, retroactive to January 15, 2022, Senior Counsel Douglas Burry, Deputy Counsel and Secretary to the Board Ruby Cochran, and Todd McManus, Director of Office of Management and Administrative Services, was appointed as Assistant Treasurer. Welcomed and sitting at their first meeting in January were new attorney member Sharil Clarke and new public member Reginald Coleman.

Personnel

During 2022, there was one personnel change within the Fund. Director Hendi retired and was succeeded by Deputy Director McCormick. The search for a new Deputy Director continued throughout the year.

Collections

The Fund's operations rely primarily on annual assessments paid by plenary lawyers, *pro hac vice* admittees, in-house counsel, foreign in-house counsel, multi-jurisdictional lawyers, and foreign legal consultants. Another source of replenishment is the money collected by the Fund's in-house legal department. In 2022, the legal department collected a total of \$639,562. In addition to the money collected through subrogation efforts, claims paid directly by collateral sources should also be noted. While in previous years there had been substantial amounts collected, in 2022 there were no collateral source amounts collected. The Fund's subrogation receipts were also impacted by the large number of pending petitions for the release of monies held in the Superior Court Trust Fund. At the end of 2022, the Fund had 12 such petitions pending before the Court with a total value of \$423,778.

Conventions and Professional Gatherings

After a two-year hiatus from attending any conventions or gatherings, the Fund accepted the invitation of Wendy Weiss, Counsel to the Board of Continuing Legal Education, to share exhibit space at the New Jersey State Bar Association's annual meeting as a means of outreach to the Bar and legal community. During the meeting, Fund Trustee Norberto Garcia was appointed Treasurer of the New Jersey Bar Association.

All three Fund Counsel attended, and presented at, the ABA National Forum for Client Protection in Baltimore on June 3 and 4, 2022. National trends, on which nineteen attending jurisdictions reported, included a decline in claim filings, but there was concern for what the immediate future could bring. Market volatility and economic issues have traditionally had a significant impact on law clients and Fund claims.

The Fund's attorneys were also presenters during the National Client Protection Organization (NCPO) workshop in Lexington, Kentucky, on September 19 and 20, 2022. Director McCormick

was installed as the NC PO president for a two-year term. As a result, it was likely that the Fund would be called upon to continue the national leadership role which it had filled for many years. Director McCormick noted that claims were down nationally, the cause of which was unknown. The next workshop would be held in Des Moines, Iowa, in September 2023, and the Trustees were encouraged to attend.

December Meeting

The highlight of the Fund's year culminates in December when former Trustees join sitting Trustees to acknowledge accomplishments, hear developments, and celebrate the end of the term for a sitting member. In 2022, the meeting was held at the Law Center in New Brunswick and Stuart Lieberman's service to the Fund was recognized as he completed his five-year term. Mr. Lieberman was presented with a plaque, embossed with a resolution signed by the Chief Justice and members of the Supreme Court. At the same meeting, Colleen McGuigan was introduced to the past and present members of the Board of Trustees as our newest Trustee starting January 2023.

The Trustees welcomed visiting Japanese Judge Kako Yoshimura from the Tokyo District Court. Judge Yoshimura thanked the Trustees for the opportunity to observe their meeting. She advised that the Bar Association in Japan also has a client protection fund, which is not part of the Judiciary.

Work Modifications Due to COVID-19

The Fund's staff continued the single work from home day per week, as per the schedule that was implemented by the Judiciary in 2021. The Fund's staff then switched to the two days from home per week schedule implemented by the Judiciary during the 2022 work year. The Fund's Case Management System and technology upgrades including hardware and software applications and remote phone answering services allowed the Fund to transition and adapt smoothly to changing work conditions. As the Fund was proactively prepared to work remotely, staff-maintained caseloads and enabled the Trustees to consider claims as well as litigation and other issues in the normal course by means of online "TEAMS" meetings.

Outreach and Succession Planning Initiatives

During 2022 the Fund made a concerted effort to inform the Bar and general public about its work. The Fund's brochure was updated, revised, and translated into five additional languages: Spanish, Haitian Creole, Korean, Polish, and Portuguese. The Fund also incorporated its claim form and informational materials into the National Client Protection Organization (NCPO) website to facilitate wider and easier access by the general public. Director McCormick made ten (10) presentations to bar associations, law schools, and civic groups, often for CLE credit, to explain the Fund's jurisdiction and claim process. In November, he also spoke to both the Judicial College, and the Judiciary's Court Executive Conference to ask that colleagues within the Judiciary remember the Fund in their daily work. In December, the Fund partnered with the New Jersey Bar Association and Lawyers' Assistance Program to introduce an initiative to encourage succession planning by New Jersey lawyers (particularly solo practitioners) as a means of ensuring that client interests are protected in the event of an attorney's untimely passing.

Interest Income

Interest income had declined after several years of increase: \$320,259 in 2018, \$491,817 in 2019, \$329,127 in 2020, \$100,069 in 2021, but was slightly up to \$191,571 in 2022. The steep decline was due to low interest rates on CD's as well as Treasury Notes during the pandemic era.

New Jersey Bar Population

The number of lawyers in New Jersey increased from 99,582 to 99,815. New lawyers added to the list of licensees totaled 1,866 while 1,633 deletions included 819 revocations, 515 deceased, 285 resigned, and 14 disbarred. The breakdown of the billing status for members of the Bar was as follows:

Annual Billing

The Fund again handled the annual assessment for itself, for the Disciplinary Oversight Committee (DOC), which funded the Disciplinary Review Board and the Office of Attorney Ethics, for the Board on Continuing Education (BCLE), Lawyers Assistance Program (LAP) and the Board of Bar Examiners (BBE). Out of the \$212 paid by New Jersey lawyers in their 5th through 49th calendar year of admission, the Fund received \$46, DOC received \$148, LAP received \$10, BCLE received \$4 and BBE received \$4; lawyers in their third or fourth calendar year of admission paid \$183 that was split \$21 to the Fund, \$148 to DOC, \$10 to LAP and \$4 to BBE. Lawyers in their second calendar year remained exempt with the Fund but paid \$35 that was split \$25 to DOC and

\$10 to LAP. The Fund and DOC shared expenses as well as revenues, but the 50-50 division of costs did not reflect the revenue split.

New Jersey lawyers were required to pay their assessment through the Attorney Online Registration and Payment Center. Payments were deposited directly into a clearing account and then split into the appropriate interest-bearing accounts. The late fee for lawyers not in timely compliance with the annual assessment was \$40. Those not even in late compliance were declared ineligible to practice law by Order of the Supreme Court effective June 27, 2022. The fee for reinstatement from the Ineligible List was \$50 if on one year's list or \$100 if on two or more years' lists, except for those entitled to the retired or military exemption for every year previously ineligible.

Non-Plenary Income

Pro hac vice attorneys, multijurisdictional practitioners, in-house counsel, foreign legal consultants, and foreign in-house counsels were required to pay their \$212 assessment through the Attorney Online Registration and Payment Center. Payments were deposited directly into the clearing account and distributed in the same manner as the \$212 payments remitted by New Jersey attorneys. Revenues from pro hac vice attorneys, who must pay the annual assessment for as long as their appearance continues in at least one New Jersey matter, was \$299,406 in 2022, down from \$307,145 in 2021. Combined revenues from in-house counsel, multijurisdictional practitioners, foreign legal consultants, and foreign in-house counsels dropped from \$62,404 to \$59,398; late and reinstatement fees increased from \$300,410 to 338,146.

<u>Claims</u>

Claims Filed and Claims Disposed

The number of claims filed in 2022 decreased to 51, down from 59 filed in 2021. Claims pending during 2022 totaled 75, of the 51 new claims, 54 were pending at the beginning of the year, and there was one previously disposed claim that was revived. Claims disposed included 43 approved, 2 discontinued, and 12 rejected. At year's end, 18 claims remained pending. The total claimed loss was \$3,692,572 and the total maximum payable was \$3,093,623.

Claims Paid

The number of claims paid in 2022, including a few approved in 2021, declined to 42, from 65 in 2021 and 105 in 2020. The total value of claims paid decreased to \$893,214 in 2022, down from \$1,461,181 in 2021, and \$3,598,300 paid in 2020. The average payments have been \$32,483 in 2019, \$34,270 in 2020, \$22,603 in 2021, and \$21,267 in 2022.

In the Fund's 54 years, 4,844 claims have been paid against 861 respondents. Twenty-six former lawyers were responsible for the damage in 2022. The nine lawyers with the highest amounts in payouts of the \$891,714 total are listed below.

Conclusion

Under the New Jersey Constitution, the Supreme Court has original jurisdiction over the admission, practice, and discipline of lawyers. The rules governing regulatory bodies ultimately exist to protect the public, and the Fund was created as a critical component of that protection to restore faith in our profession to those harmed by a bad few.

It is evident that the vast majority of lawyers are honest. Financial pressures do not necessarily translate into misappropriation to make ends meet, and lawyers overwhelmingly do the right thing even in difficult times. The Fund's work addresses deviant behavior when financial losses occur. So long as there is a healthy reserve to cover victims' losses, and the victims can appreciate the great value that the Court and the Bar place in clients' dealings with New Jersey lawyers, the Fund's mission is intact and is being fulfilled.

We deeply appreciate the lawyers, judges, and AOC who make the Fund's good work possible, and especially the Supreme Court whose support has been critical to the Fund's mission. Even during the uncertain times of the Pandemic, the commitment by the Court and the Bar to this mission has not wavered. Nor has the Fund's ability to fulfill it been diminished.

About the New Jersey Lawyers' Fund for Client Protection

The New Jersey Lawyers' Fund for Client Protection has served the same noble purpose since its creation more than 50 years ago: to reimburse clients in those rare instances when a lawyer betrays their trust by stealing funds.

Administration

The Lawyers' Fund is managed by a volunteer Board of Trustees. The five lawyers and two non-lawyers are appointed by the New Jersey Supreme Court and each member serves a 5-year term.

Proper Claims and Proof Required

To properly submit a claim, you must prove an attorney/ client or fiduciary relationship with the lawyer. You must also prove a "compensable loss", which generally means that the lawyer collected money on your behalf (to be held in trust), and then stole it.

You must be able to show that the lawyer:

- Received money or property from you;
- · Improperly took or used the funds received; and
- · Caused a loss due to dishonest conduct.

Specific proof of payment to the lawyer can include copies of cancelled checks, escrow agreements, retainer agreements, and settlement statements. You must also provide a detailed explanation of the alleged loss caused by the lawyer's dishonest conduct with each claim form.

Each lawyer charged with wrongdoing in a claim will receive a copy of the claim with its supporting documentation and will be given an opportunity to reply and provide their own proof.

Limits on Claims

There is a limit of \$400,000 for each person who makes a claim (for losses arising after Jan. 1, 2007) with an aggregate maximum for all claims against any single lawyer of \$1.5 million. These limits are among the highest in the country.



The Fund's Jurisdiction

Before the Lawyers' Fund can begin its investigation, the lawyer who you are filing a claim against must be suspended, disbarred, deceased, placed on disability inactive status, or convicted of embezzlement or theft.

You cannot be reimbursed for claims involving pure fee disputes, unfortunate or ill-advised investments involving a lawyer, or professional negligence or malpractice. The Lawyers' Fund does not pay interest or consequential damages.

How to File a Claim

You can get a claim form by writing, emailing our office, calling us at (855-533-3863, or online at LFCP.Mailbox@njcourts.gov). Our staff will help you with the filing process. The original and one copy of a completed and signed claim form must be returned to us. There is no filing fee.

How Claims are Decided

The Lawyers' Fund has a legal staff that reviews and investigates all claims, which are then reviewed by the Board

of Trustecs, who meet monthly to decide claims. Court *Rule* 1:28-3 gives the Trustees sole discretion to decide claims, including the amount, timing, and conditions of payment. The Board of Trustees can also decide to hold a hearing to take testimony from the person who made the claim, the lawyer, and other persons with televant information.

Recovery of Payments Made

If your claim is successful, the Lawyers' Fund and you will sign a *Release, Assignment and Subrogation Agreement* that will then allow the Lawyers' Fund to pursue your rights against the dishonest lawyer and anyone else who might be liable under the law. The Trustees pursue reimbursement for all claims paid in order to maintain the funds that they administer on behalf of the Bar.

Fund Resources

Payments that are awarded by the Board of Trustees are not tax dollars. New Jersey lawyers and judges, as well as those lawyers granted permission to practice in New Jersey, such as pro hac vice lawyers (PHV), multi-jurisdictional practitioners (MJP), in-house counsel (IHC), and foreign legal consultants (FLC), pay into the Lawyers' Fund each

year. The fee that lawyers pay is \$21 for New Jersey lawyers in their third and the fourth calendar year of admission, and \$46 for those in the fifth through the 49th year. Those admitted more than 50 years in New Jersey are exempt.

Helping Victims and the Profession

One dishonest lawyer can cause significant harm to law clients and also to the reputation of the Bar. The Lawyers' Fund for Client Protection is often the only means available to reimburse victims when this illegal behavior occurs.

New Jersey lawyers can be proud because the Supreme Court and the Bar are committed to protecting the public against lawyer theft by maintaining a healthy and a responsive Lawyers' Fund for Client Protection. Lawyers who help victims with their claims are prohibited from charging a fee (*Rule* 1:28-3(f)).

The Lawyers' Fund is good for the public and good for the Bar, serving both in the highest tradition of the New Jersey Judiciary.






2022 Bar Population - 99,815




Number of Claims Filed - Last 20 Years




Payments Made - Last 20 Years

Appropriations for Pending and Approved Claims

In addition to the \$321,609.47 in claims already approved, there are pending with the Fund 18 claims with a combined maximum payable of \$2,149,649.41. Based on the Fund's history over its most recent 30 years, approximately 43% of the total maximum payable has been actually approved and paid. Based on that historical data, a reserve of \$926,064.75 is presented as part of the General Fund balance. This amount is not meant to predict what the Fund's Trustees will decide with respect to any claim or series of claims. The merit of the claims themselves will determine the amount that is ultimately paid.
